I should say I was glad to get your letter to-day and to learn that you all were able to be up, but I was sorry to learn that Emma ^{Dee} was still having asthma. I guess the bad cold weather makes her asthma worse. I hope this will find you all well. I am about the same as usual. I don't see why it took so long for that money to get there, I sent you another registered letter last Saturday, I thought you would get it sooner if I registered it.

I hope you all are still having sunshine this is the third days sunshine for us since new years day. I you all have had a time trying to keep warm.

mama, I cant send any money to go on the taxes until after Feb 1st but I will send some then if nothing.

happens, I would not put all that money that Lillie sent you on those tapes if you all need it to live on. I don't guess the "Bank" will try to push you if you don't pay all of fifty dollars in January, you can tell them you will try to pay a little more in Feb.

well, I am sending two \$2.00 for you to pay that insurance at Center for me, it will be \$2.25. I wrote you in the other letter to go pay it for me, but I decided I would send you two dollars to pay on it anyway, you be sure and pay it before Jan 25th be sure and send this "stub" with the money.

Say Ellis, I bet you have been having a time tending to the stock this bad weather, guess you have had to buy some more feed by now. Say Dennerd why didn't you write me a letter. I must go as I want to get this in the mail today. you all take care of yourselves, ans real soon
