I went to Dallas again last Sunday afternoon and came back up here Monday night. Lillie and Emma & Everette are all well, but Lillie said her throat was still sore, but I think she will be O.K. now, she sure does look well and Emma does too, Emma said she weigh (111) One hundred and eleven

pounds, she don't look like
the "Baby" girl now. I sure
would like to come home, but
I can't say just when I will
get off, hope it will be soon.

Did you all go to Pleasant
Grove last Sat? I did not
go any-where not even to town.

I am sending some money,
but I hope you all ~~no~~ don't
need it now; you can save
it for a while. I would have sent
more, but I got my watch fixed and
bought me a Kakahi suit and I
have got to send \$2.25 to Mr. Mangum
for that insurance. Moma, I wish
you would write to Emma & Lillie
more often even if they don't write
to you all as much as you think

P.S. I am sending that shaving
stand, mama I don't need it up here and
I am afraid I will get it broke. You can have
the towel. Did you all get those magazines ^{and} papers?

they should write you. I think

Emma will be home sometime
in the next two weeks anyway.

I know Lillie will hate to see
Emma go home as I heard her say
so. Say Ellis; you know Good
Luck Oil Co. is about to have
to close a station or two
as they can't get any help.

Foy and Amos both worked
at No 7, yesterday, Everette
said they all had to get
under the cars and drain the
