May 25, 1943

Dear Home folks:

I wonder why I haven't heard from you all as Ellis' letter was the last I got from you and I ans it, but haven't heard from you sense, hope this will find you all well, I don't feel real good as I was on duty last night and didn't get much sleep today.

I am sure you all are very busy if it hasn't been raining down there lately, it has been pretty damp up here and real cool, don't seem much like farming time to me. I haven't heard from Lillie or Emma Dean lately.

how is Dorothy and family? I haven't heard from them either in several days. I was very much disappointed today as I was expecting a letter from you all, but didn't get it.

yes I moved in a different squadron today, so I guess I will be a military guard or police, as I did that kind of work at Sheppard ^{field} for about eight (8) or nine (9) months. They just put me on this job, and you can bet I didn't ask for it.

well, Dennard, I guess you got your diploma, wish I could have been there for the graduation. I attended the high school
