July 3, 1943

Dear Moma:

was glad to get your letter today and too learn that you all were O.K., hope this will find you all well, I don't feel so good. Guess you all got my letter and money today.

I thought you all had got a rain by now as Alford wrote me a Card last Sunday and said he had got a nice rain, hope you all have got rain by now. We are having plenty rain up here now.

Yes I sure would like to come home while Emma Dean was there, I don't know when I will get my furlow, but I hope I get it

in August. you all never have told me any-thing about how you are doing with the tomatoes. I have ask you about it, but you didn't say how much you got a pound or how much you thought you would get out of the patch. How is Ellis and Dennard also Dorthy and family? you didn't say a word about them in your letter, tell Ellis & Den they better hurry and answer my letter.

Mama, I hope you have a nice time if you go to Tyler, how long are you going to stay? I bet Ellis and Dennard has a time cooking and keeping house while you are gone. I bet they don't do much cooking. Oh yes I will

send the money for that insurance in a few days. I knew it was due in this month.

Did you all make any pictures while Emma was there? I made some a while back and I will send you some pretty soon.

Did you all go to Mt Olive last Sunday? Guess they will have a big day at Pleasant Grove today, guess you all will go down there. They are having a big Rodeo up here, but I don't guess I will go as I don't care anything much about a rodeo.

There sure was lots of tomatoes bought at Timpson as the paper said there had already been almost (200) two hundred Cans loaded. I don't have any news, and soon, Love, Leonard.
