Dear Ellis:

Glad to get your letter Friday and to learn you all was O.K., hope this finds you all well, I am about the same as usual.

I been to the hospital three times, but they didnt examine my leg and "back", but took a kidney test and said they were O.K. my leg and back still bothers me and I think I will go back to see the Dr in a few days, they dont want to do anything for you as long as you are able to walk. Guess you all were glad to get the rain, it is still

very dry here and hasn't rained  
any hardly since I came back  
up here over a month ago. Sure has  
been cold here lately, in fact it  
snowed a little here Sun eve  
and the sun was shining part of  
the time when it was snowing. I  
bet it has been pretty cold down  
there, hope it hasn't killed the  
greens and irish potatoes. Did  
they make good? hope so. Have you  
cut the cone yet? hope it turn  
out good.

Did you get Lloyd to help you  
cut any wood and what is he  
doing? Have you heard from the  
draft board yet? sure hope you  
are deferred. There is no reason why  
they should reclass you no-way

as they already know your condition  
as a farmer.

I am sending some money to  
get some Cow feed. I guess the  
meal and hulls will be a good  
feed as you can get for the money.  
This wont get enough, but I will  
send some more money before  
this feed gives out. I think about  
25 lb of meal and 75 lb of hulls or  
33 lb of meal and 66 lb of hulls  
would be about right, but you  
do which ever you think is best.

Have you sold the peanuts yet  
and was the price pretty good?  
hope so.

what do you think you may  
want for a Xmas present? I don't

know what to get. You see I just get one more payday before Xmas. Tell Dennard to write and tell me what he might want for a Xmas present. Tell Alford he better ans my letter.

How is those yearlings? OK I hope. Moma said one was sick and another one was puny.

How is Dorthey's folks? she said Howard sure like to play ball with you and Dennard. I haven't heard from Lillie and Emma in several days.

Have you planted any oats for a winter pasture yet? Take care of yourself. I don't have any news.
