The weather sure has been wet and cold here and is raining some now, guess we are in for a tuff spell of weather now; guess it is pretty cool down there now.

I have just finished washing my socks and some underwear, sure is a job to wash without a rub-board you know; but I got them pretty clean.

I am sorry you could not get the radio battery, you should have told me in your letter what kind of a battery it is so I could see if I can get one up here. You write

paper, guess he needed something
to fill up the space in the paper.

Have you heard from Mr Shepherd
lately? hope he is better now.

How are you all progressing with
the cotton picking? guess you

you write and tell me how much
you all paid for doctoring my cow
that got sick and I will send it
with the money to pay that
insurance at Center. you be sure
to pay it by the 25 of October. I
believe I will save you all the
trouble and just send it to him
by money order. you told me when
I was at home; how much you paid
for doctoring my cow, but I forgot

how much it was, so you tell me when you write me.

Oh yes we went to a Circus last night at town, saw lots of pretty girls rid those big elephants but none of them was as pretty as my girl Ra.C.

mama how is Ellis's eye and do you think it is still improving? hope so. you never said anything about it in your letter.

mama, I have thought a lot, sence I was at home, about what Alford said about the "boys" being "yellow" that tryed to stay out of the army or done things to keep from going across, he might not have been hitting at me and Ellis, but I sure have thought a lots about it, what he said.
