I got a letter from Dorothy today also one from Lillie today, said she had been sick, but was O.K now. Dorothy wrote me that Ellis almost stuck a nail thru his foot, sure hate it, look's like he is having tuff luck. Did the nail stick thru his shoe? guess he was barefooted, but he had better ware his shoes as I gave them to him to protect his feet, how is his foot now and when did he step on the nail? look's like you all could have wrote the letter Sunday and I would get it today.

I wrote you about ordering the radio battery, guess you got the letter today, sure hope it is the right kind of battery and that you get it by the 18th anyway. Has it rain any there lately? hope so. It come a nice shower here last night, the most it has rain here in about three months. It is still not very cold here yet; not near as cold as I had expected it to be.

Look's like there are lots of interest in the

election news here tonight, but some think the election will have something to do with the war, but I don't think whoever is elected, it will shorten the war. Guess you will know who is elected by the time you get this letter.

Has Ellis heard anymore from the draft-board yet? hope not. Dennard how are you doing in school by now? I bet you are hitting it hard with that Algebra. I bet you are enjoying those good parch peanuts. Have you all cut the Cone yet? hope it turn out good. Did you have much trouble moving the Chick's? I bet you did.
