## Big Vote Turnout Due On Bond Issue Saturday

Bonus Also

### Southern Pine Plans Annual Vacation Beginning Dec. 21

In a letter to employees last week, Southern Pine Lumber Co. president Arthur Temple Jr. said that all company operations will shut down at the end of the night shift Friday, December 21 and will not resume work until Tuesday, Jan. 1. This is the regular vacation period for the plant employees.

The letter stated that repair and maintenance employees will be notified by their foreman if they were needed to work during the vacation. Rules governing the eligibility of employees for vacation will be the same as previous years, Temple said.

On the same day of the shutdown, Dec. 21, a Christmas bonus will be given to all permanent hourly and salaried employees on the payroll as of Dec. 1, 1956, the letter quoted.

Bonus checks will range from amounts equal to 40 hours time to a flat \$15.00 to those who have been with Southern Pine less than 90 days but who have worked at least 95 percent of the time made available to them.

This same percentage of work time will be applicable to those eligible for the 40-hour bonus.

Mr. Temple pointed out that the bonus award was the result of employee efforts toward increased production, lower operating cost, and higher quality in production.

"We hope that this bonus will make for you a true, Happy Christmas," Mr. Temple told his employees.

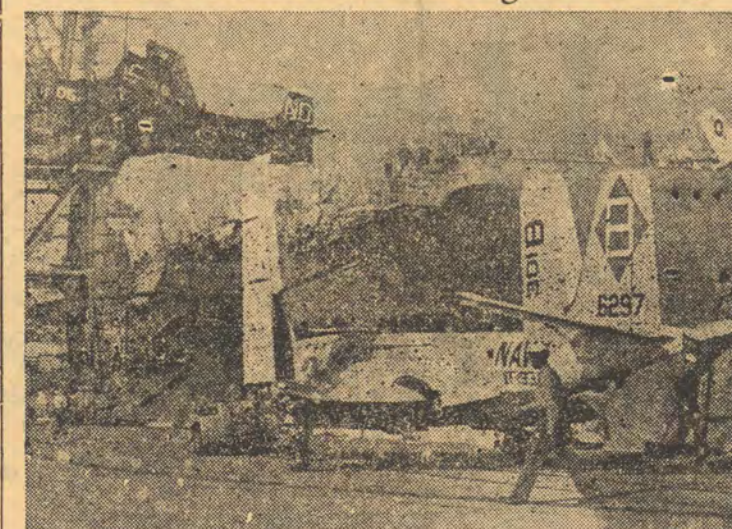
With 'prestige' a nobody becomes somebody and the world is better because of it. Without prestige, or pride, the biggest battle can be lost.

### Asks Big Vote

## Pate Outlines Rules For School Election Sat.

To the resident qualified voters and the resident school property tax payers of the Diboll Independent School District:

This is to remind you that you will have the opportunity to be a party to assisting the Diboll School Board in its efforts to build and maintain the best school possible for your children, by going to the Community Center next Saturday and voting for the propositions that this board has submitted for your approval.

In other words, the Board of Trustees of the Diboll Independent Schools has labored hard and untiring to get the evaluation of property of the district high enough so that a new bond issue may be voted to build a new elementary school.

The efforts of this board have resulted in a greater evaluation for the district which will permit the voting of \$100,000 in school bonds for that purpose if the majority of voters go out and cast their vote for the proposition.

If the voters approve the local bond issue, the adoption of Senate Bill No. 116 and the maintenance tax in the election, the Board will begin proceedings at once to get all arrangements to start a new elementary school on the same site of the old plant, which according to some of the old timers here dates back some fifty-two years.

There is one thing that this Board desires all tax payers of the district to know and understand: That if the bond issue and other propositions are carried, taxes will be increased.

The present rate is \$1.50 per \$100 of property value. This rate will be increased to \$1.80 if the value for 1957 is the same as it is now. This bond issue and other related propositions will be issued during 1957, and of course will be based on that year values.

If the increase in property values continues next year as it has in the past two or three years the increase in the tax rate will not be as high as we have figured on the present values. You must remember that as the property values increase the bond maintenance fund will decrease, and if the values were to pass the two million mark, your taxes will be the same as this year, \$1.50 per \$100 value. You are to be assured that taxes will be increased, but not to exceed 20 per cent as at the present property value.

This is the opportunity that we have been waiting for. Let's get behind this election and carry it with a large majority and

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## Response Slight On Adoption Poll

An estimated 100,000 Hungarians have fled their native country during the past months, and 15,000 of them are slated to be brought to the United States.

Hundreds of thousands of people in Europe have been subjected to Communist rule, but the Hungarians have been the only people, as a whole, to revolt against the despotic doctrines of Communism.

If these people are not met with some kind of enthusiasm from Americans, other Europeans will find it difficult to make the same kind of break from the unselected rulers.

Adoptions of Hungarian families are being made in other cities with the following points in mind: That the receiving community provide initial clothing and food requirements, provide for employment (which has already been offered by Arthur Temple and Herb White), and see that the family is correctly guided in their religious and civic beliefs.

### Will Study Plans

## Boosters Refer Fieldhouse Project To Committee; Next Regular Session Dec. 20

Diboll Booster Club again referred their proposed fieldhouse project to a committee on last Thursday, this time for detailed study on exact size and cost.

The action was voted following a brief summary of estimates given by Horace Stubblefield.

Estimates of size and cost given by Stubblefield were not revealed.

Proposed plans were given to engineers of Temple Associates

The largest number of registered voters ever to vote in a local school election is expected to be on hand at the Community Center this Saturday, Dec. 15, to cast ballots on the \$100,000 bond issue which is currently proposed by the Board of Trustees of the Diboll Independent School District to build a new elementary school.

Small, individual polls early this week pointed toward lopsided vote 'for' all propositions on both white and pink ballots Saturday, although a late turnout of those against the propositions could ruin the Board's chances of getting the required majority of votes. The old buildings now housing the first six grades of the Diboll school district were built some 52 years ago.

Of course, several of the structures have been erected since 1940. Proposed plans revealed by Supt. of schools W. F. Pate call for the new plant to be erected at the same location of the old elementary school.

Passage of the bonds would mean a 20 percent increase in taxes for taxpayers of this district. If the values are the same in 1957 as they are now, taxpayers can expect to pay \$1.30 per each \$100 of property value, unless evaluations in that year exceed the two million dollar mark. Taxes cannot exceed the 20 percent increase, no matter how evaluations may continue.

Supt. Pate, in speaking for the Board of Trustees, said that this was the chance that 'all the people of Diboll' have been waiting for, and that the Board had worked very hard in getting evaluations increased in order to call an election such as the one this Saturday.

The proposed new elementary school will have 12 classrooms, a workroom and supply room, all capable of handling 350-400 students of the first six grades.

Polls will open at 8 p.m. on the bond issue. Mr. L. W. Snelson will act as election judge.

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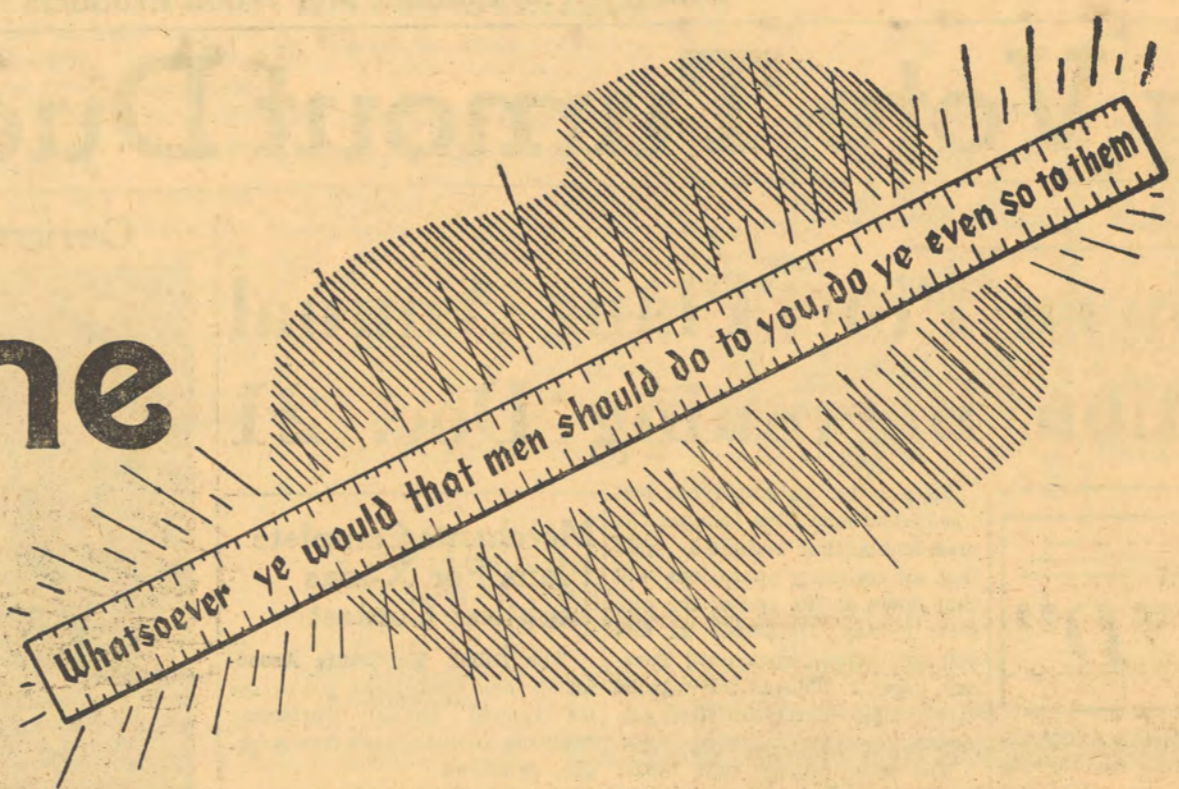

**THE MILITARY DILEMMA**

The dilemma being faced in the Pentagon by Defence Department officials is clearly demonstrated by the recent action of Secretary of Defence Charles E. Wilson. Mr. Wilson finally had to step into the row between the Army and Air Force and settle the line of Delineation of authority between the two services concerning guided missiles.

To settle the argument, Wilson gave the Air Force control of all long-range missiles, which include all those which travel more than 200 miles. On the other hand, he gave the Army authority in the field of anti-air, craft missiles, which constitutes a compromise solution in this field.

The Army is still pushing for an Air Force of its own, while the Navy is maintaining its own air force, and the Navy is still maintaining an army of its own - a very good one, we might add - and the Air Force is seeking to acquire a clear road of authority in the field of strategic bombing and hydrogen bombs. Here the Navy is involved also.

All of which leads us to the conclusion that, eventually, the military services in this country will have to be welded into a single service. There will be three branches, but the three services will be coordinated to a greater degree than is possible under the present system. Those who engineered the establishment of the Defence Department, only a year ago, envisioned a Department which would coordinate the operations and functions of the three services. It has been almost impossible for the Defence Department to weld the services together and the role of the De-

partment has actually become judge, while the three services continue to go their own way, fight among themselves about fields of authority, and duplicate themselves in many phases of defence work.

**LIMITED WAR TACTICS**

It seems pretty obvious that the Russians are using the limited war policy to throw U. S. defence and military plans off balance. The United States, with its emphases on air power and nuclear weapons in its defence program, is prepared to counter a surprise attack from the Communists.

It seems highly probable that if the United States were suddenly attacked and an all-out war ensued, this country would eventually emerge victorious. We have a powerful air force and a huge stockpile of thermonuclear weapons.

The Russians are arming the Syrians, have already armed the Egyptians and, it is reported, they are arming the Japanese. They conducted a limited war in Korea and in Indochina and they are possible ready to conduct such a war in the Middle East - if it appears that they have split the Allies and can get away with it, without starting an all-out nuclear war.

It should be remembered in this regard, that the Arabs and Israelis fought once before, after World War II had ended and that this war did not develop into a nuclear conflict. The Russians hold most of the trump cards in a limited war, since they have almost endless sources of manpower and huge supplies of conventional weapons, such as tanks and guns.

The Western powers, on the other hand, cannot match Russian strength in this respect. Therefore, in a limited war or in a fringe war, they are at a disadvantage and the United States could be suddenly called upon to bear the brunt of another limited war - confined to conventional weapons.

The situation now confronting this country, and the immediate nature of the crisis in the Middle East concerning Soviet policy, may change U. S. defence plans somewhat in the next few months. Cuts in the Army are less likely and it is also to be expected that spending will be increased and our strength in conventional weapons expanded.

Gen. Lauris Norstad has assumed the supreme command of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization' European forces.

**END TO CANCER SEEN IN PRESENT LIFETIME; M. R. DUNION SAYS**

Meffor R. Runyon, speaking to the District of Columbia Cancer Society recently, said that he was "hopeful" that we might now hope for an end to cancer in our lifetime.

Runyon said that today one patient out of every three who contracted cancer is saved, where as the rate, only ten years ago, in 1946, was one out of four patients saved. Moreover, he added doctors claimed that half the people who have cancer could be cured if they were given the proper attention in time.

He strongly recommends the annual checkup for both men and women, pointing out that women have benefited considerably from steppedup efforts to control cancer, noting that their cancer death rate dropped 12.6 per cent in the last ten years.

He advises men who sometimes do not have an annual physical checkup to get into the ha-

bit, and believes that a corresponding decrease in male cancer deaths can be achieved if these periodic physical checkups are made.

As for research being conducted seeking a cure for cancer, Runyon said this research is making progress and that it has reached a stage where it is not unreasonable to expect with confidence, an end of the cancer threat - as we know it - in our lifetime.

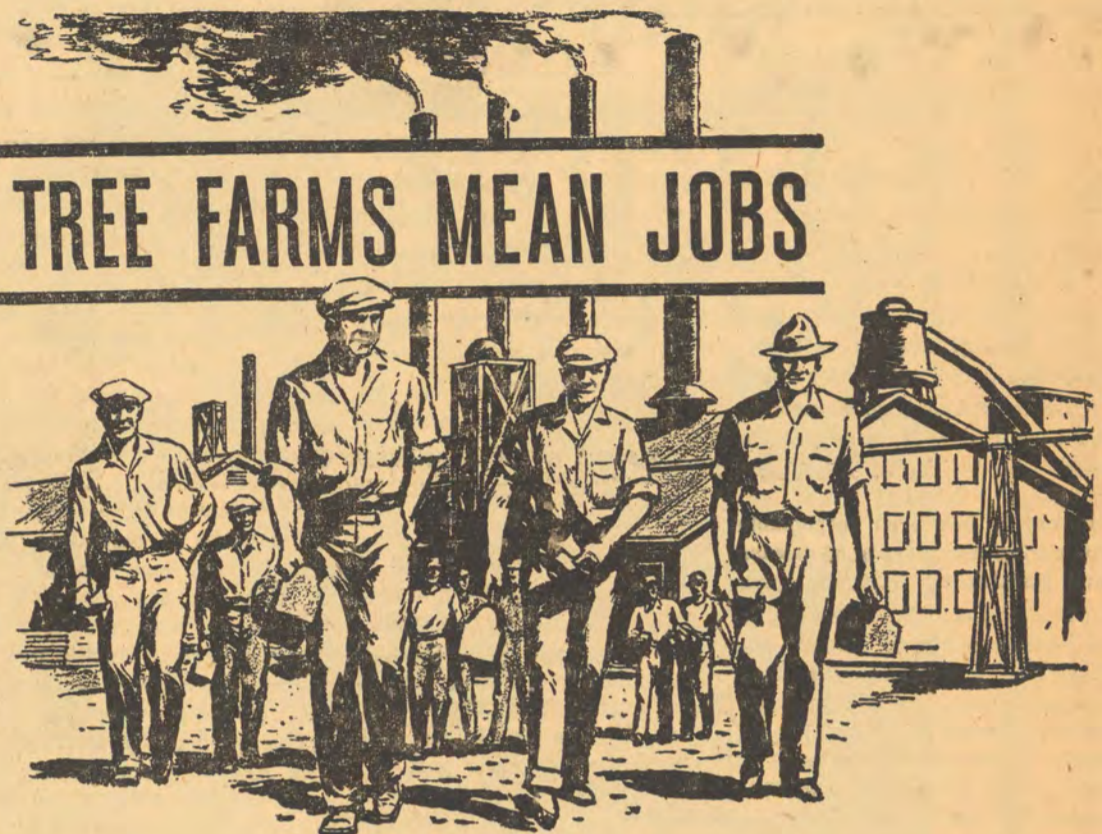
### COACH BENNIS FRANKS LEADS LUMBERJACKS TO FOURTH VICTORY TUES.

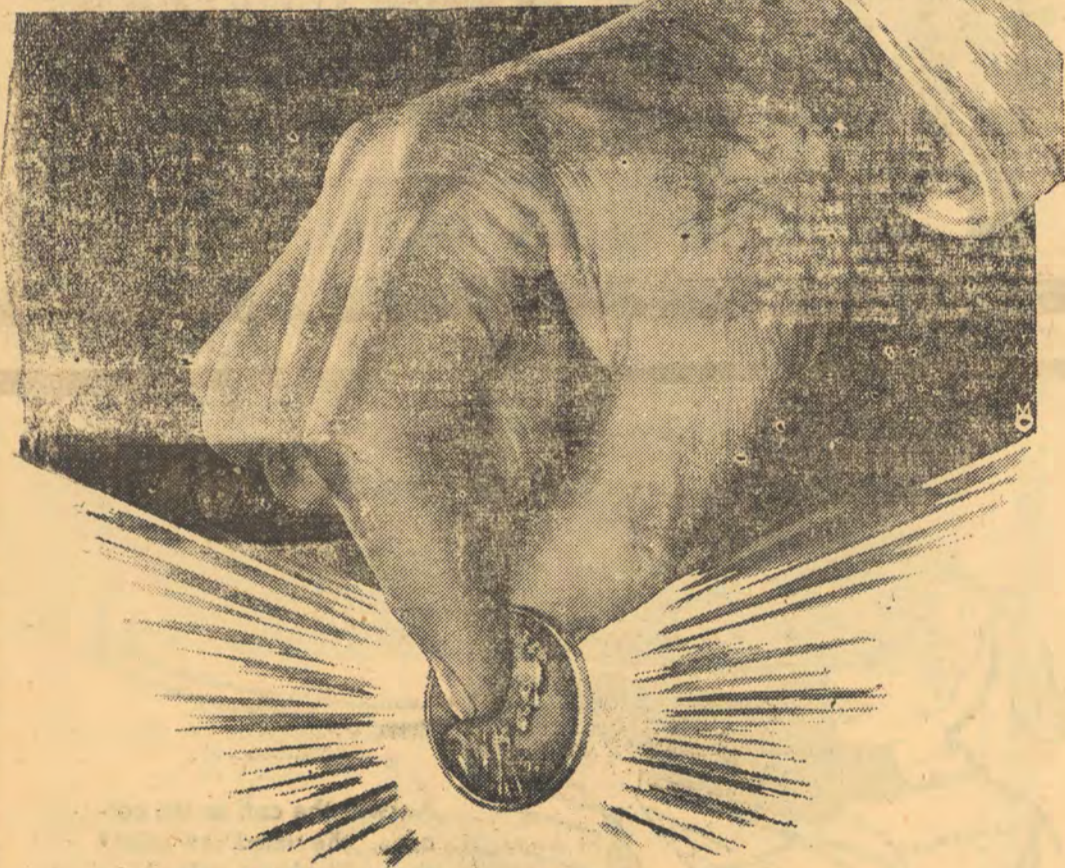
