Gentlemen:

The Texas South-Eastern Railroad Company, a common carrier organized under the laws of Texas and operating a line of railroad between Diboll in Angelina County and Vair in Trinity County Texas and from Blix to Lufkin both in Angelina County, Texas, respectfully petitions the Railroad Commission of Texas for authority to discontinue its present train schedule under which one train each way each day except Sunday is operated for the transportation of freight and passengers and to operate for freight service only.

State Highway No. 94 parallels this line between Vair and Lufkin, Texas and Federal Highway No. 59 parallels this line between Diboll and Lufkin, Texas. Both of these highways have frequent and dependable bus schedules and our service could be discontinued with no inconvenience except to a very few farmers residing adjacent to a portion of our line not closely paralleled by these highways.

We use one old second-hand combination passenger coach purchased in 1925 in this service and it is necessary to maintain in reserve one old coach of the same kind purchased in 1908. Both of these coaches are in bad condition and the cost of their maintenance and depreciation is about ten times the amount of our passenger earnings. No mail or express is handled. If we are permitted to discontinue this service both of the cars can be junked and a salvage used to good advantage.

A statement showing the number of passengers and total revenue for the period from January 1, 1937 to June 30, 1942 is enclosed herewith.

The authority of the Railroad Commission to grant relief from the provisions of the statute requiring operation of one train each day is contained in Chapter 110, Page 280 and Chapter 111, Page 281, Acts of the Forty-third Legislature, amending Article 6479 Revised Statutes of 1925.
